She was very nervous, dirty, thin, full of fleas and had overgrown nails, which suggest she was chained up for a very long time. She is now a very happy & affectionate girl.

We were sent a message asking us to help a dog who had fallen off a wall near a river and who was too scared of the water to swim to safety. The dog was very thin and wouldn't have survived, plus the river was flowing quite fast and there was a strong risk he could have been swept away. He is a Karakachan male and growled and tried to bite if any of us got too close. Tony, Rumen and the guy who first alerted us about the dog, managed to get him in a cage and carried him across the river. He is now at the shelter where he is learning to trust people.

Quinta, Mia, Ronja, Meja, Felix, Pasha and Bosco Rescued 22 October 2015

We found these seven pups dumped next to a busy road. It was pouring with rain and they were soaked through. We took them back to the shelter and all are now healthy, happy pups.

Hobart, Rylee, GiGi, Idina and Pepper Rescued 22 October 2015

These five pups were dumped at the shelter. We tried to explain that we did not have any space or anywhere to put them but they were just left anyway. They were extremely scared to start with but now they are super friendly, happy and playful.

tucked under her. She had an infection so we put her on antibiotics and pain killers. Twinkle will have to have her leg amputated when she has put on some much needed weight and is physically stronger. For now she has a cast on her leg to keep it straight and protect it. She is such a lovely friendly little cat despite all she has been through.

This poor girl had a short and horrible life thanks to so called professionals. Probably the only kindness she ever knew was from Slavena and Meral who found her and asked us to take her.




Peachy - 21 November 2015
