Whilst driving home from the shelter, Tony noticed Mama Cass at the roadside. The week before a man brought her to shelter and asked if they could take her, Liam advised him that if she was friendly she might be able to share a pen or live in the staffroom with the pups so he went over to the car to meet her. Unfortunately, she started to attack him so he told the

man they were unable to take her and the man drove her away. After work, on their way home, the boys spotted her running about the town in a panic, they tried to catch her but no luck. The next day they set off in search of her with a cage and food but after hours of searching they could not find her. Liam was upset and beating himself up because he knew the little dog was all alone and scared. The man had obviously dumped her.

Tony eventually managed to catch her and took her back to the shelter. She let them examine her and it became apparent that she had just given birth. It was starting to get dark but they had to find her babies so they set off with

her and parked up at the same spot where Tony had caught her and let her go. Tysan and Luke kept track of her and followed her up into the forest to an old shed where they found five tiny pups. She wasn't happy about being moved again but they had to get her back to the safety of the shelter.



Mama Cass has now relaxed and enjoys her daily walks around the shelter. Unfortunately, three of her pups passed away quite quickly. Her two remaining pups were named Moppy and Doerak but sadly Doerak passed away on the 22 February 2016.


Daika, Brent, Bunty, Leski and Millie Rescued 25 January 2016

She was rushed to the vet and stayed there for a week so she could be on a drip and receive antibiotics. She is now back at the house where she has to be fed through a syringe. The vet seemed to think that the damage is through injury and not cancer. Snowdrop's condition is still serious but despite her injuries she now responds to people and enjoys a fuss.

The mother dog was so scared she would run off and hide in the forest every time she was approached so the lads quickly made a makeshift shelter to protect the pups from the cold. It was RSDR's intention to visit them every day, try to catch the mum, and take them all back to the shelter. When they went to check on them one day they had gone missing but managed

to find where they were being hidden. Just as they arrived a woman ran off with one of the pups, jumped in her van and drove off. They know who she is, so they intend to check on this pup but the remaining four were taken to the shelter. Unfortunately, it seems the mother dog was chased off as she has not been seen since.


Richelieu, Brina & Ginger Rescued 23 February 2016

These three pups were found at the roadside. The old man that brought them to the shelter advised their mum and been hit and killed by a car.



Barry Rescued 27 February 2016

This large boy was found on the streets of Plodiv with a massive tumour on one of his back legs. He was taken to Provets, the vets we use in Plodiv, where it was agreed that his leg should be amputated. The people who found him had only raised a percentage of his vet bill which is over 700 levs. They needed someone to pay for the remaining and then take him from the vets as there is nowhere else for him to go but back on the streets. RSDR of course agreed to both. He is now at the shelter recovering.

Neli & Twinkle's Vet Bills

Little Neli, who was rescued in December, had successful surgeries on her back broken legs. After more x-rays it became clear her front right shoulder was broken also. Thankfully, She is expected to make a full recovery. Neli is a very special little lady to be so loving after every thing she has been through in her short life.

Twinkle, who was rescued in November 2015 with a badly broken leg, has to have his leg removed. He recovered well from his surgery and shows no signs of slowing down!

Tink

Tink had been dipping her back legs slightly when she walked so was taken to the vets. The vets described her condition as 'floating knees'. She had her first operation and is now back at the shelter where she is to have complete rest.

Raphy

At the end of November 2015, an old lady asked RSDR for help. She asked them to take her 5 year old Pekingese because she could not cope with him any more. He was taken to Tony & Diane's house, where he soon settled in. RSDR got him vaccinated, microchipped, castrated and put him up for adoption. A lady from Holland fell in love with Raphy through photos and videos and decided to adopt him. Raphy was supposed to be on the adoption bus in mid Feb but due to unforseen problems with issuing the Bulgarian export certificates, it was cancelled and re-organised for the week later. During that week, a lady and her family turned up at the shelter asking about Raphy, they had photos on their phones of him. The lady had gone to help her two daughters who had just had babies and left Raphy with a friend. The friend then gave Raphy to us saying she could not cope with him and told the family he had run away. The lady had not stopped looking for him and, by chance, heard he was with us. Although the lady who was going to adopt Raphy is very sad, it is clear from the pics how happy everyone was when they were reunited.



SHELTER RENOVATION APPEAL



This year RSDR want to concentrate on getting as many adoptions as possible so they can make space to do the renovations for the three parts inside the shelter which include: gutting, plastering of walls, floors and building proper separate pens and drainage. Their other goals are for a new perimeter fence, gates and new exercise yard fencing that was damaged in the storm.

We have set up a fundraiser to first go towards the perimeter fence, gates and exercise yards and we have put the first target goal as $\in 10,000$.

This goal figure is not accurate as we have no quotations from the Builder at this stage. This could take months as we have to source a new builder, as the one we currently used has now moved town. But if we can start fundraising this year towards our target goals, whilst reducing the animals at the shelter by half, with adoptions, we can then start renovations.

RSDR has currently over 200 animals at the shelter, and to start renovations we need to get the figure of animals down to at least half.


The search for Faolan (Hanneke Wijnhoven)

Friday 26 February, 17:31. I just left a home check with Banner in Tilburg in the South of the Netherlands when I was called. It was Patty who recently adopted Faolan. The first thing I thought was "She won't just call for any little thing, he is gone". And yes, Faolan was frightened by another dog during a walk and managed to slip out of his collar. In utter panic he ran off in the other direction, out of Patty's sight. In the case of a missing dog or cat, NL team member Jenny is our go to person. She directly warns all team members who warn different organisations that can help, they make flyers and spread the word via social media.



Tommy (Faolan's foster dad), Shelly, Olaf and I directly drove North to Arnhem to help Patty and Pascal in the search for Faolan. Initially there were no sights of him and it was already getting dark but we decided to walk around and call for him anyway. We decided it might be best to save our energy for the next day when it was light again. Olaf stayed a while longer but the rest of us decided to head home. When I arrived home, the first messages had come in of sightings of Faolan. 'Where is our Angel' (an organisation which, with the help of volunteers and sniffer dogs, helps find missing dogs) created a Whatsapp group for residents in the area where Faolan went missing was the central point where sightings of Faolan were sent to. With all the information coming in, Olaf and Patty decided to go to last location mentioned and around Iam, Olaf himself saw Faolan. But Faolan was clearly in utter panic and ran away

from anyone who came near him. The search team had no choice but to stop. Early the next morning, sightings of Faolan were still being sent to the special Whatsapp group: He had been spotted several times around the same rural area close to the city where he went missing. Patty, Tommy, Shelly, Olaf and several local volunteers meet up in this rural location to look for him. He was spotted several times but once again, he was in total panic and would steer away from any person coming near him. Only then did I realise that due to his intense panic, he might not even recognise the people he knew so well, especially Tommy. . I quickly called Arlette who is able to connect with animals and has previously worked with Faolan to help him relax and ask her if she could help. She has managed to connect with him before and, believe it or not, she could try to connect with him from a distance. Right after our call at around I Iam Arlette tried to contact Faolan but due to the panic rush she was not able to connect with him. After just a short while this changed: According to her the panic subsided and she could make it clear that Tommy, Olaf and the others were there to help him. His fear and panic while roaming around the rural farms and fields became motivated determination as you walked closer and closer to town. While connecting with Faolan, more and more sightings were coming in through the Whatsapp group as he started moving from the rural area, back towards the busy town. Our wary Faolan, who gets nervous oh so quickly, was all of a sudden walking towards town! Around 11:45 Arlette stopped with her support and it was up to Faolan now. With every sighting sent through the Whatsapp, the search party came closer and closer to Faolan's possible location and all of a sudden, out of the blue Faolan stepped out in front of Shelly's car. Tommy and Patty jumped out and called him. Without a second of doubt, Faolan ran straight towards Tommy! Quickly,



What a relief! There are so many stories of dogs going missing that do not end well. Faolan was lucky that Patty called directly after he ran off and all the wheels could be set in motion to find him quickly again. Facebook and the Whatsapp group were essential in finding Faolan. Communication seems to be the key to success here: online and possibly telepathically too. And not to forget, trust! For at least three months Tommy worked on building up trust with Faolan with a lot of patience. Without this trust, this story could have ended up differently.

We would like to thank all who were involved in finding Faolan and making sure he could go back to his new forever home!


